OUR EMIGRANT ANCESTORS
(Continued from Vol. I, No. 4)

Referring to Vol. I, No. 2, "The Chestnut Tree," April 1976, we find that Dr. P. M. Agee stated that Judith Chastain married Anthony Agee in France and were the parents of Mathieu and Mary Elizabeth Agee of Manakin Town. In this issue, we will discuss Mathieu Agee, using Dr. Agee's account of this family. ("A Record of the Agee Family," published August 1937, Independence, Missouri, pp. 6-8.)

Mathieu Agee was born near Nantes, France, about 1670 and came to Virginia in 1690. He married Ann Godwin, daughter of Isaac and Ann Godwin. Issue:

3. James Agee, born in Virginia, 1725; died 1821. He was a soldier in the Revolution. He married in 1746, Mary (Elizabeth-?) Ford, daughter of James Ford and Ann Bondurant, and granddaughter of Jean Pierre (John Peter) Bondurant. James Ford was a son of Pierre (Peter) Ford and Mary Elizabeth Agee, mentioned above. James Agee and Mary (Elizabeth-?) Ford had issue: (Dr. Agee does not list the issue in chronological order of birth.)

In the Name of God Amen I Peter Chastaine of the County of Goodland and Parish of King William being sick and weak but of sound mind and perfect memory (Blessed God do make this my last will and Testament in manner following — first and principally I give my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it hoping through y^e merits of my blessed Saviour to receive a Joyfull resurrection and as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in manner following)

I give and devise unto my son John Chastaine and to his Heirs for ever one Tract of Land lying between John Lavillane and Jacob Amices containing by Estimation ninety Acres it being the Land where my said son lives.

I give and Devise unto my son Peter Chastaine and to his Heirs for ever the tract of Land whereon I live it being One Hundred and Eleven Acres and is bounded on y^e lower side by y^e Gleabland and the upper side by y^e Land of Susanna Kerner and Glode Gory.

I give and Devise unto my son Pere Chastaine and to his Heirs for ever one tract of Land containing three Hundred Seventy Nine Acres lying on Jones's Creek it being the Land whereon my Bottom lives


I give and Devise unto my Daughters Judith Susanna Mary Elizabeth and Magdalin and to their Heirs for ever one Tract of Land containing by Estimation two Hundred Seventy four Acres lying on the lower Manakin Creek to be Equally Divided between them and their Heirs for ever my will is that my daughter Judith to have the lower part it being where she now lives — Susanna to Joyn to her Mary to Joyn to Susanna Elizabeth to Joyn Mary and Magdalin to Joyn Elizabeth and if either of them die before they come of Age or Marry then the Land —

belonging to them that die shall divide between my other —
 Daughters that I own her. I give and bequeath all if rest of my —
 Estate to be Equally Divided between my wife Magdalin my —
 three Sons John, Peter, and Rene, and my five Daughters: Judith
 Susanna, Mary, Elizabeth, and Magdalin, to them and their
 Heirs for Ever and I do hereby constitute and appoint my
 two Sons John Chastaine and Peter Chastaine to be Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby Revoke
 all other Wills by me made In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this 3rd day of Octo. 1728.

WILLIAM CHASTAIN

Youngest Son of Rev. John Chastain
(Contributed by Rollo Stovall)

There has been some speculation about what happened to William Chastain, the youngest son of Rev. John Chastain. Rev. James Garvin Chastain said he settled near Huntsville, Madison County, Alabama. Mr. Benjamin J. Kincaid had him moving about Georgia and Alabama, ending up in St. Clair, Alabama.

The incident related by Rev. Garvin Chastain on page 283 of his book, "A Brief History of the Huguenots and Three Family Trees: Chastain - Lochridge - Stockton," indicates that the first wife of Rev. John was living in 1797. Rainey Chastain, b. 28 Sep 1793, tells a story about his Grandfather, Rev. John, when he, Rainey, was about four years old: He, imitating his grandfather, washed his head under the spring spout. Grandma Mary O'Brien?, was upset and asked why the child's head was wet. Rev. John replied, "He wants to wash his head and neck and up behind his ears like I do." This shows that Mary his first wife was still living in 1797 and that Rev. John would not have married a second time until after that date. So his second wife could not have given birth to William until around 1800, after Violet was born but before the birth of Lavina in 1803.

In 1810 Greenville County, South Carolina, census: Mary Shatain (uncrossed "t") Female age 45 up, 1 Female u/10 - Lavina?, 1 Female 10-16 - Violet?, 2 Males 10-16 - William and a young cousin or nephew?

In 1820 Greenville County, South Carolina, census: William Shatten 16-26, 1 Female 45 up - Mary? 1 Female 10-16 - Lavinia?. This William was born about 1800. If this is Rev. John's son, then he would have reached his majority by 1822, when in St. Clair County, Alabama, he deeded to his half-brother, Blind John Chastain, the property which he had inherited from his father, Rev. John in 1803. To my knowledge no Chastain has

been found to have lived in either St. Clair County or Madison County around this time. In fact, very few descendants of Pierre Chastain are found in Alabama this early. It is assumed that young William was in St. Clair, temporarily, with his mother or some other relative or acquaintance. Or, he may have gone out as a missionary as his father did many years earlier.

It will be recalled that William had relatives in Habersham County, Georgia. There is an unidentified William Chastain who married Margaret Dobbs, 19 Oct 1825, Habersham County (Book A, p. 78, Habersham Marriages 1824-1864). A William Chastain sold land in 1827-28 in Habersham County to Thomas Dooley, Jr., implying that he was probably moving from the County. In 1830 census of Rutherford County, Tennessee, there is a William Chastain with a wife and two young daughters. In 1850 census of Madison County, Alabama, there is a William Chastain, age 49, Preacher, b. South Carolina, wife Margaret, age 43, b. Tennessee, Sarah 23, b. Tennessee, and Lavina 20, b. Tennessee. Was Lavina named for his younger sister?

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

The Articles of Incorporation for the Chastain Family Association have been duly signed and verified and filed in the State of Oklahoma, 4 November 1976. The Secretary of State of Oklahoma has issued a Certificate of Incorporation to the Pierre Chastain Family Association.

THE CHASTAIN FAMILIES OF MANAKIN TOWN IN VIRGINIA -- continued in Vol. 40, No. 1, January 1964 THE AMERICAN GENEALOGIST -- by Cameron Allen

The conclusion that Pierre Chastain came from Charost in Berri differs very substantially from the conclusion as to place of origin found in the only generally available account of the family, given as an appendix to the Rev. James Garvin Chastain's remarkable A Brief History of The Huguenots and Three Family Trees: Chastain-Lochridge-Stockton, 1933 (at pp. 258-308). The Rev. Mr. Chastain, knowing that Estienne Chastain came from Dauphine, and believing that Estienne and Pierre were "perhaps second cousins," stated that "Pierre was born in the Province of Dauphiny and married Marie Madeline de la Rochefaucald." This statement has been repeated ad nauseam in Virkus' Compendia of American Genealogy. Not content with giving Pierre such a wife and such a birthplace, the Rev. Mr. Chastain giddily leaps the centuries and takes us back from Pierre no less than eighteen generations via such personages as "Rene Chastain, page to Louis XIII," to "Chateigner, Seigneur de la Chateigner, lived in France in about 1084 A.D." The data set out on each generation are so skimpy, that one has no opportunity to test for plausibility either chronologically or geographically. However, we are assured that the information is derived "from the genealogical archives in Paris, France." Some comfort may be taken from the fact that no Merevingian descent was claimed.

Pierre Chastain's second wife was Anne Soblet, born say 1684, the daughter of his fellow immigrants, Abraham and Susanne (Brian) Soblet, refugees from Sedan in the Champagne to Virginia via London (C. Allen, "Sublet Family," to be published in the Detroit S.G.R. Magazine). The Register of King William Parish makes this clear, for on "3 April 1723 died Anne Soblet, the ___ (wife of Mon)sieur Pieere Chastain, aged about ___ years; was buried the 4th of the month." (Register of KWP, VHS Collections, n.s., 5:110)

Chastain was elected to serve on the first vestry of the newly created Parish of King William, about 1701. On 25 Aug. 1718 Pre. Chastain was again elected to the vestry, and on 25 Nov. 1718 he was elected by that vestry as Church Warden along with Abraham Salle (KWP Vestry Bk., VMHB, 12:28-30). On 18 Dec 1718 he took the oaths required of holders of both offices (*ibid.*) On 20 April 1720 the two Church Wardens were replaced by Estienne Chastain and Pierre Louis Soblet (*ibid.*, 2:243), although Pierre Chastain continued on the vestry. By July 1726 he was again serving as Church Warden. He remained on the vestry until his death in 1728 and following his death his accounts as Church Warden were rendered by "Mr. Jean Chastain, in place of his father" (*ibid.*, 12:376).

Pierre Chastain at first followed an extremely conservative policy of land acquisition when one considers his prominence, but this is not to be wondered at in view of his vocation. Distribution of 111 acres was made to him on 23 March 1715 as his part of the first 5000 acres set aside for the French refugees (Virginia Patent Bk. 10:266). By about 1723 he is credited with only 65 acres in the parish (VMHB, 13:278). On 9 July 1724, a second patent was granted to "Capt. Peter Chastain of Henrico County for and in consideration of Importacon of ffour persons to dwell within this our colony and Dominion of Virginia whose names are Mary Chastain, Jane Chastain, Peter Chastain Junr and Walter Povalle?" which contained 379 acres on the west side of Jones Creek (Virginia Patent Bk. 12:15). It is difficult to understand why he listed these children as importees, as they all seem clearly to have been born in Virginia; daughter Jane was deceased by the date of the patent, though he was not the less entitled to claim for her thereby. Possibly these children had been on a visit to Europe, to whom one wonders. But another possibility is that they were all the children of the first wife, whose names may have been duplicated among the children by the second wife; see below. By 1727/8 Pierre's holdings in the parish totaled 1063 acres. He had secured a 574-acre tract from Rene Laforce sometime

between 1723 and 1728 by a deed which apparently was lost in the destruction of the Henrico County records (see recital in deed by his daughter Elizabeth LeSueur, Goochland Co., Va., Deeds, Wills, &c., 3:332). Pierre's will disposes of 1154 acres, being the patents for 111 acres (given to son, Pierre), 379 acres (given to son Rene), the 574-acre tract (given to his five daughters, and a 90-acre tract for son Jean) which appears to be the same 90 acres son Jean had patented in his own name in 1715.

Following his second wife, Anne's death in 1723, Pierre married (3rd) Mrs. Magdelaine (Flournoy/Fleurnois) Trabue, a native of Geneva, daughter of Jacob Flournoy and widow of Antoine Trabue. Trabue was born about 1667-8 at Montauban in Guyenne, and was buried in King William Parish 30 Jan 1723/4 (KWP Register, VHS Collections, n.s., 5:111). "Chastaing" helped to take inventory of Trabue's estate 19 May 1724; which inventory was returned to Court 3 Oct 1726 by "Magdalene Chastain" (Henrico Co., Va. Deeds and Wills, 1725-1737, p. 59.)

Pierre Chastain died in the Parish of King William, then Goochland County, between 3 Oct and 20 Nov 1728, the dates of the making and probate of his will. The will names his wife "Magdalin," his three sons John, Peter and Rene, and his five daughters, "Judith, Susanna, Mary, Elizabeth and Magdalin," listed without married names. He signed the will with customary "Chastaing" (without Christian name). (Goochland Co., Va., Deeds Wills &c., 1:43)

His widow Magdalene made her will 2 June 1729 and died prior to the first Monday in May 1731 when her testament was presented for probate. She named only her own children, all by her first husband: Jacob, Anthony, Magdalene, Judith, and John James Trabue, and appointed her brother Francis Flournoy executor (Henrico Co., Va., Deeds, Wills No. 1, Part 1, 1725-1737, pp. 304-5, defectively published almost in full in Huguenot Society, Founders of Manakin in

Virginia, Publications, No. 5, pp. 93-4).

Determination of the maternity of the children of Pierre Chastain is fraught with some difficulty. His will appears to name the children in order of birth after first separating them by sex. The sons may be assigned to the correct mother with comparative ease, because we can estimate rather closely the age of each, thanks to the near completeness (extending from 1710 to 1738) of the King William parochial tithe lists on which free white males became listable at age 16. The daughters are a more difficult problem. I would assign the second daughter Susanna to the second wife Anne Soblet, primarily because I believe her to have been named for Anne's mother Susanne (Brian) Soblet. The eldest daughter Judith could have been the child of either the first or second wife, as I have found no way to estimate her age with any degree of precision. I incline to the supposition that she was the daughter of the first wife. Pierre Chastain is listed with wife, two sons and four daughters in 1714. These figures exclude John and possibly daughter Judith. ("Liste Generale")

Before setting out Pierre's issue, it is necessary to take some notice of the listing of daughters given by the Rev. Mr. Chastain (op. cit.). My points of disagreement are expressed in parentheses:

4. Judith, m. Mr. Ballew.
5. Marianne, d. 1724 in Manakin Town. (Note: This Marianne was not Pierre's daughter, but his daughter-in-law, his son Jean's first wife.)
6. Susanna, m. Abraham Soblet. (This is a substantial genealogical twist: Pierre's wife Anne was the daughter of Abraham Soblet and his wife, Susanne Brian. Thus the Rev. Mr. Chastain listed Pierre's mother-in-law as his daughter. Susanna, Pierre's daughter, married James Robinson, as will be shown below.
7. Mary.
8. Elizabeth (no marriage given; married David LeSueur).
9. Magdeline, m. William Salle. (Correct!)

Issue of Pierre Chastain, pere, by his first wife, name unknown:

- 3 1. Jean (John) Chastain, b. by 1694, as he is accounted for as a tithable on the first list of 1710. Some writers have wrongly assumed that John was a contemporary of Estienne and Pierre, and have even stated inaccurately that he is listed separately on the ship-lists. The assumption that Jean was a contemporary of his father seems to have arisen from the fact that when the Refugee Lands were distributed in 1715, Jean, being then an adult, received a portion. This does not mean, however, that he was an adult at his coming to Virginia. His sonship to Pierre, if any doubt exists, is shown conclusively by the following: The parish vestry records on 16 July 1729 say of the deceased Pierre's accounting as warden: "The same day Mr. Jean Chastain, in place of his father, and Mr. Louis Soblet rendered their accounts in full for the year 1726."
- 4 ii. Judith Chastain, m. _____ Ballew (Ballou). By 6 Nov 1733 she was widowed, for on that date as "Judith Bellew Widow of the Parish of St. Jameses, County of Goochland" she sold to Peter Gurrant of the Parish of King William a tract "on Manikin Creek... devised unto...her...by her late father Peter Chastain deceased... containing 115 acres" (Goochland Co., Va., Deeds, Wills, &c., 1:440). Nothing is known to the compiler of any issue or remarriage.

On 15 June 1731 the couple sold to Thomas Dickens 115 acres and "likewise the Lands to be by me arising by reason of the death of my sister Mary...after the making and proving of her late father Peter Chastain's will" (Goochland Co. Deeds, Wills, &c., 1:258).
- 5 vii. Pierre Chastain, fils, b. c. 1707; first appears as a tithable in the household of his father in 1725 as "Pierre Chastain, f(ils)."
- viii. Mary Chastain, b. say 1709, d. between 20 Nov. 1728 when her father's will was proved, and 15 June 1731 when her sister Susanna sold Susanna's one half of Mary's 115 acres left to Mary by her father. She did not live to marry in all probability and certainly she left no issue. The other half of Mary's acreage went to her sister Elizabeth as directed by her father's will.
- 6 ix. Elizabeth Chastain, b. say 1711, probably m. ca. 1732-3 David Le Sueur. On 30 Jan 1739 David Le Sueur and Elizabeth his wife sold to James Bryant (i.e., Jacques Brian) 171 acres "by Peter Chastain left in his Last Will and Testament to his daughter Elizabeth." The 171 acres represented Elizabeth's own directly inherited 115 acres, and half of her sister Mary's acreage, which fell to her at Mary's death. (Ibid., 3:332.)

xii. (Marie) Magdelaine Chastain, b. c. 1720, m. c. 1740 as his second wife, Guillaume Salle.

3. Jean Chastain was born not later than 1694, as he was accounted for as a tithable on the King William Parish list of 1710. He was listed in his father's household through

1712, and in 1713 he was listed in a separate household. He married presumably in that year to Marianne _____ for on the c. 1714 list he was definitely a married man without children ("Liste Generale," VHS Col., n.s., 5:74). On 23 Mar. 1715 "John Chastaine" was granted 90 acres of the Refugee acreage, bounding on Jacob Amonet (Va. Patent Bk. 10:267). This was his sole holding on the land list of 1723 (VMHB, 13:279). He does not even appear on the land list of 1727/8. By his father Pierre's will of 1728 he was given the same 90 acres he had patented in 1715, so it would appear Jean had deeded this tract to his father between 1723 and 1727, the deed having been lost in the partial destruction of Henrico County's records during the Revolution. On 15 Aug. 1737 he patented 112 acres on "lower Monacan Creek" (Va. Patent Bk. 17:406), and on 18 July 1738 he purchased 279 acres on Buck Creek from his future brother-in-law William Salle (Goochland Co., Va., Deeds, Wills &c., 3:149).

By 30 July 1722 Jean Chastain was serving on the vestry of King William Parish (KWP Vestry Bk., in VMHB, 12:249). On 16 Apr 1723 he and Anthoine Givodan were elected Church Wardens (ibid., 12:250). At the end of his year as Warden he reverted to plain vestry status. On 23 Sep 1727 "Jean (du) Chastain was elected Clerk of this Church in the place of Mr. Jacques Soblet, and there was assigned to him E5, either in wheat at 3 sh. per bu. or maize at 18 pence per bu. or in tobacco according as the vestry shall judge proper to make levy at 10 shillings per hundred" (ibid., 12:373-4). He continued as clerk down to the close of the register in 1750. It has been said of his clerkship: "His entries are written in a fair, legible hand; but his French bears marks of having been learned in the colony" (ibid. 12:373-4). On 18 Aug 1733 "Estiene Chastain and Jean Chastain were elected church wardens" again (ibid., 13:73). On 8 Sep 1739 Jean's honorarium as clerk was raised: "It was agreed to give Jean Chastain E6, the grain to be accepted as in the first contract" (ibid., 13:184).

Howard H. was the son of Madison C. Chastain of Forsyth County, Georgia, grandson of William Chastain of Hall County, Georgia, and great grandson of Abraham Chastain of Greenville County, South Carolina. Three of the children of Madison C. Chastain moved to Texas and one to Oklahoma (Paul's Valley).
