GENEALOGIST'S REPORT

Our genealogist, Elby Bowman, stated he felt our progenitors, Pierre Chastain and his wives (the mothers of his issue), would be proud of our organization. He added we have approximately 2,000 family group sheets. We have hundreds of descendants yet to be identified and many Chastain families which cannot be traced back to Pierre at this time but whom we know belong to his family. Elby urged <u>everyone</u> to send in Xerox copies of pertinent documents such as wills, heirship type deeds, Bible records, biographies from various histories, cemeteries (tombstone inscriptions), etc. In sending published articles, pages from printed biographies, Bible records, etc., please always include a Xerox copy of the title page to enable the source to be identified. The Association is trying to become a "clearing house" to assist all Chastain researchers.

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

Section XIV of our By-Laws were changed by vote to read as follows:

"Annual dues per member of the family association shall be <u>as determined by the</u> <u>Executive Committee</u>. Additional contributions may be requested according to the financial needs of the family association in administering its program. Dues shall be payable annually, <u>on a calendar year basis</u>."

The Internal Revenue Service has expressed objection to a set amount being stipulated in our By-Laws. As previous stated, the By-Laws read that annual dues, per member, shall be \$5.00. This amendment is intended to overcome their objections. The other change to this section changes the membership year from the date of our annual reunion to a calendar year basis. This is to facilitate bookkeeping and to assure all members receive our publication "The Chestnut Tree" on a calendar year basis. Members who join during the remainder of 1977 will be for the calendar year 1977 and they will receive all four issues of "The Chestnut Tree" for 1977. Members who have already renewed their membership for 1977-1978 will be credited for 1978 dues.

RECEIPTS

Receipts for membership/subscription or for any other purpose that the Secretary-Treasurer has previously been sending receipts will no longer be sent if the amount is paid by check. Receipts will be sent if payments are made by cash. Our Secretary-Treasurer is filling in as Membership Chairman until someone else volunteers to accept the Chairmanship. This practice will save time and effort.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE ASSOCIATION

Contributions to the Pierre Chastain Family Association are always needed and wanted. This year, however, there are a number of projects for which you may request your contributions be applied. These are:

Chastain Pew at Manakin Episcopal Church: Helen Ingle Ezell proposed that the Association endow a pew at the Manakin Episcopal Church at Powhatan, Virginia. The cost will be \$250. plus the cost of engraving the brass plate to be placed on the pew. This is the church that Chastains attended in their first years in this country. Many of the other early Huguenot family names appear on pew plates and it is sad that the name CHASTAIN does not appear, particularly since Dr. Pierre Chastain was a leader in the early community. It was voted by the membership present that a token payment (\$150.) be sent to the rector with a request to reserve one of the remaining four or five pews for the Chastain family. The Rector of the Manakin Episcopal Church has replied that he is reserving a pew until the rest of the money can be raised.

"Little Otter to Lost River": Claude E. "Gene" Cook wrote this book as a history of the Chastain families who migrated from Virginia to Kentucky and Indiana. As of now, there are only four copies in existence. This manuscript has been edited, retyped, repaged, and indexed by Publicity Chairwoman, Loyce Coolidge, and assisted by her daughter, Jeanne Short. It is nearly ready to send to a publisher. Gene Cook has researched this particular group of Chastains for the last twenty years and has done a marvelous job of compiling their history. Your support in getting this book into print is urged.

<u>Historical and Genealogical Record of Chastain Families</u>. Robert Leishman, Historian, is compiling a historical and genealogical record of the Chastain families represented by members of our association. We also hope to publish this book in the future.

FRANCIS SHATTEIN

The following is contributed by Lowell B. Chastain and expresses his own opinions about what he considers a very important find relating to the Pierre Chastain family:

"About 5 years ago I noted in the book "Virginia Wills and Administrations 1632-1800" by Torrence, the following entry: Francis Shattein 1703a for Henrico County. On three visits to the Virginia State Library at Richmond, Va., I attempted to locate this document with the assistance of the librarians. The entry could not be found. I followed these visits up with a letter requesting a copy of the document. March 9, 1977, I received another reply from the Virginia State Library which reads as follows: 'Dear Mr. Chastain: We have consulted our indexes to early Henrico County wills and have also checked the county deed and will book for the years 1697-1704 without finding the Shattein document listed by Torrence. It does not appear either under that name or as Chastain. All wills were entered in the same book; there was no procedure for recording wills of foreigners separately. We have concluded, therefore that Torrence made an error, either in transcribing the name or in identifying the date or the county.'

"June 15, 1977 I again visited the Virginia State Library. I obtained the Henrico County Deed Book 1697-1704. Starting with the very first entry in 1697 I read every entry which was difficult reading. However, on page 390 under the date of November 1, 1703 was the following entry: 'Administration granted unto John Martin and Margaret his wife of Francis Shattein Estate.'

"John Martin was the father of Judith Martin who married 1st Thomas Gevedon and 2nd Rene Chastain, Sr, son of Pierre. Dr. Agee stated that Pierre Jacob Chastain was the son of John Francis Chastain and Frances Jane Reno. Reference Page 10 Vol 1 No. 1 of The Chestnut Tree. So it would seem that the Francis Shattein estate entry of November 1, 1703 could only be John Francis Chastain father of Pierre.

"Also, that Pierre's father came on the same ship as Pierre and could be the Quintin Chastatain which Mr. Cameron Allen says was apparently a single man and of whom Mr. Allen stated no further records appear. Regardless, the November 1, 1703 entry is official and speaks for itself. This is absolutely the first information or indication that I have seen published to account for Francis Chastain as having come to Virginia and having died there. If anyone has any other record or ideas to further identify this Francis Shattein I suggest they submit it to the Editor of The Chestnut Tree for publication."

Australian Singer, TV Star ... Martha Blanche Nixon Returns For Visit With Family At C'Burg

Martha Blanche Chastain, who left Campbellsburg in 1951 to follow her singing career, returns from her home in Sydney, Australia this week to visit her family the Roger Humphrey's on R.R. 2, Campbellsburg, and to attend the wedding of her eldest son, David Alan in Downers Grove, Illinois on August 13th.

Martha Blanche married Rev. Leslie Nixon at Mt. Tabor Christian Church on June 5, 1955 and soon after sailed to Australia to take up Gospel singing. They settled in Sydney and have since blanketed the land of Australia with their work.

Martha has since become one of Australia's best known TV personalities, with her daily Gospel show seen on 25 of the nations 31 commercial TV stations. Her records and cassettes are widespread, and she is constantly travelling to various centers to sing and speak at women's functions and to be featured with her TV team in the famous "WATSA-NAME SHOW" routines.

Her evangelist husband, Leslie, has developed a unique flying Gospel work which takes him by light plane clear across the nation often, attending to the spiritual needs of people who live in isolated and disadvantaged areas in Australia's notorious desert regions, known as the "dead-heart" of Australia. He often lands at the famous outback place of Birdsville, located in the treachourous Simpson's Deserts, which was crossed by white man as recently as 1939. Teacher's making course palatable

A sign in Lyn Chastain's office warns visitors— "Bull shipping department. Watch where you step."

Visitors can be assured the only thing they will step into is this woman's world of agriculture.

"Women have always been actively involved in agriculture," said the only woman faculty member of the agriculture department at East Texas State University in Commerce.

She continued, "Women have worked alongside their husbands in the field. And even now the wives of farmers and ranchers are genuinely interested in their husbands' work."

Mrs. Chastain's area of specialization is meat science, an all-encompassing study of the phases of meat — its muscle, flavor and juiciness — industry and processing and consumerism.

A graduate of the University of Florida with a master's degree from Texas A&M University, Mrs. Chastain's special area of concern is meat palatability and she would like to do further study into various methods of meat cookery.

"Many people like a well-done meat product," she said, "but they don't realize that high temperatures produce more shrinkage and toughness because of the loss of juices.

"Another mistake people make in meat preparation is mishandling it. They leave meat out in the open for hours, increasing the chances of microbial damage. Life begins at 40 degrees Fahrenheit as far as microbial damage is concerned, so it's much better to thaw meat in the refrigerator." she advised.

Other meat tips Mrs. Chastain offered were to prepare meat properly for freezing with freezer paper that has a waxy paper side to it (clear plastic wrap and styrofoam containers are not ideal) and to save a welcome dollar here and there by making your own meat cuts, such as stew meat from a chuck roast.

In choosing a cut of meat Mrs. Chastain cautioned to look for the grade on the cut. "Color is important, too," she added. "Beef should be bright red, pork should be grayish-pink and lamb should be pinkish. And the meat should have no dark brown spots.

"If you're looking for juiciness and flavor, choose pieces with a lot of marbling and not just around the edges. The center area of the cut should also have some marbling. But if you're a calorie-counter, you don't want all this fat, so look for leaner cuts. And always be aware of how much bone is in a piece of meat and which cuts are tender naturally."

According to Mrs. Chastain, age plays an important part in meat tenderness. "As an animal gets older, the meat becomes tougher. Animals under four years usually have basically tender meat. The extremely young baby beef is actually tender, but lacks marbling and juiciness so it seems tougher. This type of meat also has a high water content and that water disappears when the meat is cooked. When cooking baby beef I advise using some form of moist heat," she said.

In addition to her meat science class, the Florida native also teaches introductory courses in animal science and agricultural economics. She and her husband Jack, executive secretary for the Texas Hereford Association, live in Fort Worth. She drives to Commerce in the wee hours of Tuesday and returns to Fort Worth after her Thursday classes.

In her spare time she likes interior design, needlepoint, crochet and occasionally cooking. Her design knowledge should come in handy at her Commerce abode. She lives in a barn at one of the ETSU agricultural complexes about five miles out of town.

"Actually it's an apartment that was created for a graduate student, but it's good shock treatment when you say you live in a barn." Mrs. Chastain joked.

THE CHASTAIN FAMILIES OF MANAKIN TOWN IN VIRGINIA, continued in Vol. 40, No. 1, January 1964, THE AMERICAN GENEALOGIST, by Cameron Allen

In passing, it may be mentioned that while at present it is unknown how the name René came into currency in the Chastain family, its use therein has continued down to the present day. In remote rural areas, the origin, meaning and spelling of the name René have been quite forgotten, but under the guise of "Rainey Chastain" the name combination continues in service today.

Issue of René and Judith (Martin) Chastain:

- Isaac Chastain, b. 15 Mar. 1733/4, King William Parish, godparents being Jean Chastain (presumably the elder, René's half-brother), Jean Martin (Judith's brother) and Jeanne Martin (KWP Register, <u>VHS Col.</u> 5:89). This was apparently the "Isaac Chastin" who in 1774 advertised the taking up of a stray bay mare in Buchingham County (<u>Virginia Gazette</u>, Rind, Williamsburg, 12 May 1774, p. 3, vol. 3). He had died or departed from the county by 1782. It is <u>possible</u> that he was the father of the Chastains of Franklin County, Va., who were marrying in the 1780s and the 1790s, including "Renny Chastain" who would thus have been named for his paternal grand-father.
- ii. Pierre Chastain, b. 6 Nov. 1736, godparents not given: migrated with his father from Buckingham County to Edgefield District, S.C., where in 1786 he was named executor under his father's will. The 1790 Census lists him in 96 District of Edgefield County, S.C., 4 free white males 16 and over, 2 free white males under 16, 5 free free white females, and 12 slaves.
- iii. Marianne Chastain, b. 17 May 1738, godparents being Jean Chastain, Magdalene Chastain, and Janne Martain (KWP Register, <u>VHS</u> <u>Col</u>., n.s. 5:96).
- 11 iv. Rene Chastain, b. 28 June 1741 (family records as given in Taylor, <u>Virginia Baptist Ministers</u>) or 30 June 1741 (KWP Register, <u>VHS Col</u>. n.s. 5:101), godparents being his father and (Charlotte) Judith, wife of his uncle Jean Chastain.

v. Judith Chastain ("Jude"), m. _____ Winfree.

8. (Mary) Magdelaine Chastain, b. ca. 1720, married ca 1740 in King William Parish, a widower, Guillaume Sallé, b. ca. 1705, son of Abraham and Olive (Perrault) Sallé. He is first mentioned by name as a tithable in the list of 1723. He married first, ca 1727, Elizabeth _____, believed to have been the daughter of Antoine Gevedon. She bore him at least five children, the youngest of whom was born 27 July 1739. Guillaume's next child (his first by Magdelaine) was born 22 April 1741, so that the first wife's death must have occurred following childbirth in 1739 and Guillaume's remarriage must have fallen in 1740.

A few years after his second marriage, William Sallé became interested in new lands to the west and on 12 Jan. 1746/7 patented 1200 acres in Goochland on both sides of Joshua's Creek of Slate River (Va. Patent Bk. 25:431). This was repatented to him in a larger grant of 1978 acres "in the County of Albemarle" on 12 May 1759, bounding on Capt. William Allen and William Sublett (<u>ibid.</u>, 34:272). In the meantime "William Salle of the Parish of St. Anns in the County of Albemarle" in a whole series of deeds in May 1750 had virtually stripped himself of realty in King William Parish (Cumberland Co., Va., Deed Bk. 1:133, 151, 154, 158, 163). He added further Slate River land by purchase from Joseph and Anthony Benning in 1750 and 1751 (Albemarle Co., Va., Deed Book 1:259, 339). With the division of Albemarle in 1762, his activities in the new Buckingham County become more obscure. In 1771, feeling the advance of age, "William Sallie, Senior" advertised for sale two tracts of land "on the Branches of Slate River in the County of Buckingham" containing 950 acres and 400 acres "with all necessary Houses for cropping and is convenient to Church, Mill, and Courthouse" (Virginia Gazette, Purdie and Dixon, Williamsburg, 26 Dec. 1771, p. 3, col. 2). As "William Sally Sen^r" he was taxed in 1782 on 700 acres in Buckingham. He was taxed on personalty in Buckingham annually through 1789, and then the tax list of 1790 records tax imposed on "Wm. Sallee Est^t." His widow Magdalene survived him some years, being carried on the personal property lists through the year 1800, and still carried on the realty lists in 1803.

- iii. Jean Sallé, b. 2 Nov. 1745 (<u>ibid</u>. 5:105).
- iv. Olive, b. 5 Nov. 1749 (ibid., 5:108); named for her paternal grandmother.
 - v. Jacob Sallé, b. say 1751; taxed in Buckingham County in 1782 on 4 slaves, 4 horses, 21 cattle and 400 acres.
- vi. Abraham Sallé, b. say 175_; listed as a tithable in the lists of 1787.
- vii. George Sallé, b. say 175 or 176; mentioned in tithe lists of 1787 and 1788.
- viii. Stephen Sallé, b. ca. 1764; listed as a tithable in 1782 in the household of his father; settled at an early date in Madison Co., Kentucky, where the Census of 1850 lists him, aged 86.

9. John Chastain, Jr., born in King William Parish 26 Sept. 1721, is listed in the Tithe List of June 1744, as "Jno. Chastain, Jun." in the household of his father (<u>VHS</u> <u>Col.</u>, n.s., 5:112-115). On 3 Feb. 1749/50, Jean Chastain Jun. took the oath of vestryman for King William Parish (KWP Vestry Book, <u>WHB</u>, 13:275-6). He married first, Frances Branch, and on her death ca. 1762-3, he married second, ca.1764, Elizabeth Logwood.

He migrated about 1777 to Bedford Co., Va., where on 24 Mar. 1777 James Boyd sold 380 acres on the north fork of the Otter River for £150 to John Chastain of Cumberland County (Bedford Co., Va., Deed Bk. 5:468). On 25 Jan. 1804 he made his will, proved 28 Sept. 1807 (Bedford Co., Va., Will Bk. C:160), which names his wife Elizabeth and children (apparently in order of birth): daughters Molly Leasure, Elizabeth Chastain, and Fanny Vasor; sons John, Lewis, William and Stephen Chastain; and daughters Edith Wheat and Jane Hewitt.

- vi. Lewis Chastain, b. 2 Dec 1766, bp. 17 Jan. 1767 (Douglas Register, p. 292).
- vii. William Chastain, b. 16 July 1768, bp. 28 Aug 1768 (<u>ibid</u>. p. 292); m. in Bedford Co., Va., 12 Jan 1792, Lydia Wheat, dau. of Joseph Wheat (Hinshaw, <u>op</u>. <u>cit</u>. 6:891). On 23 Mar 1816 in Bedford County, Edmund Tate of Campbell Co., Va., appointed William Chastain of Adair Co., Ky., his attorney to recover £421 of Jesse Cofer (Bedford Co., Va., Deed Bk. 14:493).
- viii. Stephen Chastain, b. say 1770.
 - ix. Edith Chastain, b. say 1772; m. ____ Wheat.
 - x. Jane Chastain, b. say 1775; m. _____ Hewitt.

10. Rene Chastain, born say 1745, was the only one of Pierre Chastain's sons to remain in Buckingham Co., Virginia. There the extant tax records list him from 1782 on as "Rane Chastain son of Peter" or "S.P.", to distinguish him from his first cousin of identical name in the same county, called on the tax records "Rane J^r" or "A.B.Preacher." Rene Chastain died by 1818 in Buckingham County, leaving a widow Martha _____, for the <u>Richmond Enquirer</u> of 15 Sept. 1818 carries this nonresident advertisement: "In Chancery, at a Court held for Buckingham County, 13th day of July 1818, Daniel Guerrant, complainant against Lewis Chastaine, Isham Chastaine, James Hudnall and Rhoda his wife, _____ Jones and Elizabeth, his wife, John Chastaine, Jacob Chastaine, William Chastaine, William Ayres and Mildred his wife, _____ Moss and Martha his wife, and Judith Chastaine, children and heirs of Rane Chastaine, dec., and Martha Chastaine, widow and executrix of the Last Will and Testament of the said decedent. Defendants Lewis, Hudnal and wife, John, Jacob, and Wm. Chasatine are not inhabitants of this state."

Issue of Rene and Martha (____) Chastain:

- i. William Chastain, b. ca. 1769, first listed (unnamed) as a tithable in his father's household, 1788; listed with him and named in 1789; m. Magdalen Ayres, b. 16 Aug 1778, Buckingham Co., dau. of John and Jane (Sallee) Ayres; settled in Logan Co., Ky.; eleven children listed in Nellie Ayres, <u>Ayres Kin and Kin to Kin</u>, Memphis, 1961. Magdalen's birth is given in the Pension Application of Jane (Sallee) Ayres (Rev. Pens. Files W 4120, John Ayres, printed in John Frederick Dorman, comp., <u>Virginia Revolutionary Pension Applications</u>, 3:67-68).
- ii. Joseph Chastain, b. ca. 1771, first listed (unnamed) as a tithable, 1788; named as a tithable, 1789; was listed in Buckingham Co. through 1793; not named as an heir of his father in 1818.
- iii. Lewis Chastain, b. ca. 1773; first listed as "L. Chastain" in his father's household in 1792; listed as Lewis in 1793; not a resident of Virginia in 1818.
- iv. Rhoda Chastain, b. 1775; m. James Hudnall; they settled in Warren Co., Ky.
- v. Elizabeth Chastain, b. say 1781; m. in Charlotte Co., Va., 16 Sept. 1802, Peter Jones, surety being Isham Chastain and witnesses being Isham and John Chastain (Knorr, <u>Marriage Bonds of Charlotte Co.</u>, <u>Va.</u>, p. 48)
- Vi. Isham Chastain, doubtless older than Elizabeth, said to have m. 1791
 Sallie Howell; m. in Halifax Co., Va., 20 Jan. 1806, Frances Camp (Wirt J. Carrington, <u>History of Halifax Co.</u>, <u>Va.</u>, p. 432).

- vii. John Chastain, b. ca. 1783, first listed as a tithable in 1800; m. in Charlotte Co., Va., bond dated 4 Feb 1806, Polly Bottom, dau. of Miles Bottom (Knorr, <u>op</u>. <u>cit</u>., pp. 15-15). Not a resident of Virginia in 1818.
- viii. Jacob Chastain, b. say 1787; m. 1808 Judith Ayres; settled in Logan Co., Ky.
 - ix. Mildred Chastain, b. say 1789; m. William Ayres.
 - x. Martha Chastain, m. ____ Moss.
 - xi. Judith Chastain, b. say 1793.

11. Rene Chastain, Jr., born either 28 June 1741 (Taylor, <u>Virginia Baptist</u> <u>Ministers</u>, series 1, pp. 205-07) or 30 June 1741 (KWP Register, <u>VHS</u> <u>Col.</u>, n.s., 5:10) in King William Parish. He moved out of the Parish at a very tender age with his parents who settled in that portion of Goochland County which became successively Albemarle County and Buckingham County. "Though his education was much neglected, his morals were of the most unimpeachable character" (Taylor). He was married "in his nineteenth year" (therefore, ca 1760). Anne Faure (Ann Ford), born 24 Feb. 1738 in King William Parish, daughter of Jacques and Anne (Bondurant) Faure (KWP Register, <u>VHS</u> <u>Col.</u>, n.s., 5:98). Outside limits to the ca. 1760 date of marriage are set by a deed of 28 Feb. 1761 by her father "James Ford of the County of Albemarle in Tillotson Parish to Anne Chastain of the said county & parish" of 100 acres in Albemarle on a branch of the Slate River (Albemarle Co., Va., Deed Bk. 3:15).

Soon after his marriage "under the (Baptist) preaching of Elder C(hristopher) Clark, (he) was awakened to the exercise of pungent conviction for sin...In August 1770 he was baptized...and immediately began to preach Christ to the people. In April, 1772, Buckingham Church (Baptist) was constituted, at which time he was ordained. He was at once chosen their pastor, and continued in this office as long as he lived, a period of 53 years" (Taylor, pp. 205-07). In the period just prior to the Revolution, he became involved in the Chesterfield County anti-Baptist troubles. At various times he supplied regularly the Cumberland, Providence and Mulberry Grove Churches.

Taylor's date for the constitution of the Buckingham Baptist congregation, 1772, seems just a little late, for the "Minutes of the first Separate Baptist association held at Craig's Meeting House in Orange County, second Sat. in May 1771" record "Rane Chastain, jr." as a delegate from "Buckingham, a new church" (Robert B. Semple, A History of the Rise and Progress of the Baptists in Virginia, Richmond, O'Lynch, 1810, p. 49). Semple, a contemporary, places the founding of the Buckingham Church as occurring in 1771. "It was not long before Mr. Chastain, their present pastor, commenced preacher. He has been their pastor, their only one, from the beginning. Surely no people need ask to be more blessed in a pastor. Under him the Church has prospered almost uniformly Under the prudent management of this venerable pastor, they have not passed through such severe conflicts as some other churches. Mr. Chastain is now an old man, and ripe for the Crown that awaits him. As a preacher he is held in high estimation for soundness, simplicity and usefulness" (pp. 215-16 of Semple). "Rane Chastain" is also credited with having "planted" the Union Church in Buckingham County in 1786.

He continued to farm as well as preach, and in 1782 was listed as the owner of 300 acres in Buckingham (Buckingham Co. Real Property Tax Lists). Of his dual vocation, Taylor says: "By his churches he was tenderly loved....It is much to be regretted they failed to supply him such a support for his family as would enable him to devote more time and labor to their spiritual good Elder Chastain would sometimes say, if the Lord will keep me humble, the Churches will keep me poor. And so it was, for he would often during the week be compelled to plough until the hour for public worship, and again return to the field. He could truly say his own hands ministered to his necessities. The personal property tax lists of 1782, calling him "Rane Chastain jr, account for two slaves (Will and Sall), six horses and twelve cattle. The 1784 personal property tax list credits him with two slaves, two horses and nine cattle. He is there denominated "Rane Chastain Jun^r (A.B.Preacher)" (A,B, standing for Anabaptist, the then current appellation for Baptists in Virginia), to distinguish him from (1) Rene Chastain Senr., his father still living in South Carolina, and (2) his first cousin Rene. living in Buckingham, who is called by way of distinction on the list, "son of Peter." The 1785 list shows him with a total of five tithes, only one of them being a slave, the others being himself, one son over 21, and two sons between 16 and 21. The 1787 list calls him "Rane Chastain (Divine)." The decease of "The Rev. Rainey Chastein, 85, in Buckingham County" is reported in the (Richmond) Family Visitor of 22 Nov. 1823 (reprinted in VMHB, 68:64). Actually he was 82 years of age. Taylor says, accurately, "After an illness of five weeks, he calmly resigned himself to death, in the 83rd year of his age."

Issue of the Rev. Rene (Rane, Rainey) and Anne (Faure) Chastain, as listed in Nellie F. Ayres, <u>Ayres Kin</u>, pp. 87-88.

- i. Stephen Chastain, b. Nov. 1764 according to his deposition in support of the pension claim of John Ayres' widow Jane (Sallee) (Rev. Pension File W 4142, in Dorman, op. cit., 3:67-68); listed in his father's household as a tithable in 1782; by 1785 listed there as aged 21 or over. On 12 Apr. 1786 he was bonded in Buckingham County to marry Mary Amonet (under age), dau. of William Amonet who consented to the marriage. (This bond is among the handful of Buckingham bonds which survive, now in the possession of the Virginia Historical Society, Richmond; published in VMHB, 57:82, by Mrs. H. A. Knorr.) Stephen Chastain is listed in a separate household from 1787 in Buckingham County. He served in the Virginia militia during the Revolution, though apparently not actively. "Chastain and Ayres mustered in the same company under Capt. Robert Cary. They met at the Court House and a number including John Ayres were drafted. Chastain was left behind. The draft was for a three months tour in 1780 or 1781." Chastain was still resident in Buckingham County
- on 17 June 1842 aged 77. (Pension File <u>supra</u>)
 ii. Martin Chastain, b. 30 Nov. 1768, Buckingham County; first listed by name as a tithable in his father's household in 1788, although possibly listed by number as early as 1785. Given his paternal grandmother's surname, he continued to be listed as a tithable in his father's household through 1790. He married about this time (ca. 1791) Elizabeth Ayres, b. 31 Mar. 1774, d. 15 Apr. 1849. From 1792 to 1801 he is listed in a separate household from his father. He apparently left Buckingham about 1801-1802 to settle in Bath County, Ky., where he d. 9 Sept. 1816. Among his seven children were sons Rene (named for the boy's grandfather) and Levi <u>Chastan</u>, the latter of Decatur County, Iowa (Nellie F. Ayres, <u>Ayres Kin</u>, pp 87-88; and <u>Biogr. and Hist. Record of Ringgold and Decatur Counties</u>, Iowa, Chicago, Lewis Pub. Co., 1887, pp. 696-697).

- iii. Elijah Chastain, b. ca. 1776, first listed as a tithable in his father's household in 1793; listed in a separate household from 1797 on. He is said to have sold out his holdings in Buckingham County in 1828 and to have settled first in Indiana and then in Illinois. He had at least one son, Benjamin.
- iv. Lydia Chastain, b. say 1774, said to have d. in 1805; m. Thomas Maxey. Their issue included Asa (b. 1792), Rhoda (b. 1794), Anna (b. 1797), Thomas (b. 1802), and Lorney Ann.
- v. Rhoda Chastain, m. James Ragland. Their issue included sons James Ragland, Jr., and Reuben Ragland.
- vi. Magdalen Chastain, m. Jacob Carter; said to have had twelve children.
