



"My parents, James Edward Wiley and Sophia Irene Derr Chastain, were married April 4, 1909, in Woodward, Oklahoma. Being young, adventurous and romatic, they outfitted a covered wagon and set out for Canada....They crossed Canada to the west coast, headed south, and stopped for a short time in Portland, Oregon, which was then known as the City of St. Johns."

Loring Chastain's grandparents were Jehew Corydon and Emily Catherine (Chancellor) Chastain. Jehew Chastain's parents were Rainey and Judah Elizabeth (Watts) Chastain. Rainey Chastain was born in 1822 in Georgia, the son of Rev. Jehu Chastain whose wife may have been Martha Carter. Rev. Jehu Chastain was the son of Edward Brigand and Hannah (Brown) Chastain of Fannin Co., Georgia. And his lines on back were: Rev. RESEARCH TIPS IN TENNESSEE

Tennessee is considered by some genealogical researchers as one of the most difficult states in which to work. Part of this difficulty is because of the loss of early census records for East Tennessee. Another reason is that Tennessee was one of the "passing through" states.

The first complete census for the State of Tennsessee is for the year 1830. Early tax lists for the various counties must be used as a substitute for the years before 1830. There are a few counties in Middle Tennessee for which the 1820 census is available. These tax lists, plus petitions, voter lists and newspaper lists of inhabitants have been indexed and published by Byron and Barbara Sistler. For further information and catalogue, write to Byron Sistler & Associates, 1712 Natchez Trace, Nashville, Tennessee 37212. The Sistlers have also indexed the 1830 and 1850 censuses for Tennessee. These are available in most large libraries and can be purchased from the Sistlers.

The migration routes through Tennessee were some of the most heavily traveled because they contained two of the easiest passages through the mountains: the Cumberland Gap and the Valley of the Holston and Tennessee Rivers. The majority of early Tennessee inhabitants had their routes in Virginia, North and South Carolina, with Kentucky running a close fourth.

The Tennessee State Library and Archives will perform very limited research by correspondence. One must write to the library for special forms on which to make their requests. Only three requests are allowed at one time. The staff has been inundated with requests as in other state libraries. You must be prepared to wait about three months for a response. If the records are found that one requires, information concerning the charge for photo-copies of the desired documents will be sent.

The Lawson-McGhee Library in Knoxville, Tennessee, is an excellent source for East Tennessee records. The McClung Collection contains many unpublished manuscripts, personal papers, and Bible records. All have been card indexed. The library staff does not perform any research by correspondence. The library also has most of the published records pertaining to East Tennessee counties. There is no inter-library loan service on genealogical books.

The University of Tennessee in Knoxville does permit some books to be obtained on inter-library loan, mostly county histories.

One of the most helpful published sources containing county information for the State of Tennessee is "Tracing Family Trees in Eleven States." First published in 1970 by members of the St. Louis Genealogical Society, it was reprinted in 1976 because of the great demand by interested genealogists. For information concerning price and availability, write to: St. Louis Genealogical Society, Suite 268, 1617 South Brentwood Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri 63144. This book also contains information concerning county records for the states of Missouri Illinois, Kentucky, Virginia, Georgia, Ohio, North Carolina, South Carolina, Indiana, and Pennsylvania.

For individual county maps for the State of Tennessee, write to Tennessee Department of Transportation, Office of Research and Planning, 400 Doctors Building, 706 Church Street, Nashville, Tennessee 37201. These county maps include locations of all extant churches, cemeteries, schools, creeks, rivers, etc., and can be an invaluable aid to the genealogical researcher.

Charles W. Chastain was born 14 Dec 1839, place not known. His P. O. address at the age of 75, in 1915, was Mt. Vernon, Jefferson County, Illinois. He married Mary Jane Bates on 3 Apr 1862 in Jefferson County, Illinois, and neither one of them had been married before. He died 26 Dec 1920, in Mt. Vernon, Jefferson County, Illinois. Mary Jane Bates Chastain/Chastine was born 1 Mar 1847, Jefferson County, Illinois. She was dead by 26 Mar 1921.

Civil War - Private, Captain Wall's Company (D), 31st Regiment, Indiana Volunteers; enlisted at Terre Haute on 5 Sep 1861 to serve during the war.

Copy of Discharge for Disability: Daniel Shastine served in above company during the war. He was born in Washington County, Indiana, and was 23 years of age; 5'9" tall. During the last two months, the said soldier had been unfit for duty 30 days. He fell sick 28 Sep 1861 and has been helpless for a month and a half. Signed: James A. Walls, Calhoun, Kentucky, 20 Dec 1861. J. B. Armstrong, Surgeon of the 31st Indiana Regiment certified that said Daniel Shastine suffered from chronic bronchitis, resulting from exposure and general debility and stated soldier should be discharged. Discharge dated 4 Feb 1862, Calhoun, Kentucky.

Certificate dated 23 Apr 1887, of A. A. Aspenwall, of a true copy of the family record filed with claim #319191, listed minors of Daniel Chastain, Pvt., D Company, 31st Indiana Regiment from a Bible record -- Bible printed 1855:

Affidavit of Mary A. Woodard, widow of Daniel Chastain, in Sullivan County, Indiana, 12 March 1887: "I testify under oath that said Daniel Chastain was never married until we were married in the year 1855 August 21 and that I was not previously married up to that date. That I never abandoned any of the children that they are all alive but at the present none of my children except <u>Elizabeth</u> Chastain is remaining at home with me."

From Pension application, Sullivan County, Indiana, 30 Aug 1884 of Mary Ann Woodard, widow of Daniel Chastain: Daniel Chastain died 14 Jun 1870 at his home in Sullivan County of acute fevers of some kind which was superinduced by chronic diarrhea. Mary Ann Chastain remarried John Woodard, 19 Jul 1875.

By deposition, 12 May 1886, Thornhill, Marion County, Alabama, Sarah Chastain stated she was the widow of Edward Chastain and the mother of David D. Chastain. She was 75 in 1886. They were married in October 1825 in her father's house in Hayward County, North Carolina. She was Sarah Shelton prior to her marriage to Edward Chastain. Children of this marriage were:

The family moved from Hiawatha, Thomas County, Georgia, to Marion County, Alabama in 1859. Edward Chastain was thrown from a horse and died in May 1868.

Addean Chastain - Widow - Pension Application #646547 - no certificate

Edward Chastain was born ca 1842, White County, Illinois, son of Daniel Chastain who lived near Elm Grove in White County, Illinois.

Addean Mobley and Edward Chastain were married on 28 February 1886 in White County, Illinois. Both had been previously married but names were not mentioned of former spouses.

Edward Chastain, age 43 in 1885, stated he was born and raised within three miles of Emma, White County, Illinois. His father was still living in 1877.

The only child mentioned was a daughter "ready for high school" in 1887 but her name was not mentioned. Edward Chastain belonged to the Methodist Episcopal Church. He died 2 Nov 1895.

(Edward) James Chastain was born ca 1836. He married first to Louisa <u>Funcher(?)</u>. They had one daughter (or at least only one listed in pension records) who was: Missouri F. Chastain, born ca 1864. Louisa (Funcher) Chastain died in Oct 1873 in Franklin County, Arkansas. He married second to Clarissa Jane (Morgan) Colquit(t), widow of William A. Colquitt, who died Aug 1872 in Franklin County, Arkansas. James Chastain and Clarissa Jane Colquit(t) were married 20 Sep 1874 in Franklin (EDWARD) JAMES CHASTAIN (continued)

County, Arkansas. He was 38 and she was 42. James Chastain died 24 Sep 1880 in Franklin County, Arkansas.

When Clarissa Chastain applied for pension, she stated she had never heard his name as Edward James Chastain; that no one had ever called him Edward and she did not know where the name Edward came from in his records. The above listings do not by any means include all the burials in the Lost River Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery. The list does include all of the family name Chastain that was located. There may be stones which are covered or gravesites which are not marked. Undoubtedly many of those buried there with another family name are related. A few other family names are included because of their close association with the Chastain family. More research would probably tie almost all of those with another family name into the Chastain family through marriages. There may be errors in this listing. Sometimes due to the age of the stone and the weather, it is difficult to read them. It is interesting to note that two of the five brothers (Renny and George) born about 200 years ago in Virginia are accounted for in this listing.

Lowell B. Chastain stated he intended to continue his search in Indiana for the other brothers, Barnett Sr., Robert and Valentine Sr.

The Lost River Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery is fenced in and generally well maintained. It is maintained from the interest from a "Cemetery Fund" created several years ago. Mr. Chastain stated that to his knowledge vandalism has not been a problem but there are continuously stones which need repair because of aging or falling over and breaking. Any donations to the Cemetery Fund would insure better maintenance and would be welcomed.
